Learn how to create abstract paintings with fluid acrylic paints. We'll use Golden acrylic paints and commercial pouring medium to create organic, unpredictable, and colorful compositions. Intergenerational fun - appropriate for young adults 10 years and older accompanied by an adult. No art experience required.

The instructor will provide the following:

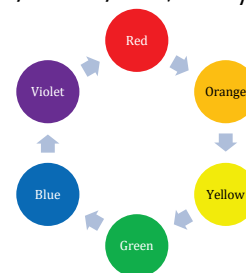
- Variety of surfaces including two 8x10 inch wrapped canvas per student for a final composition and a variety of other surfaces for test pours
- GAC-800 pouring medium*
- Additional acrylic paints pouring medium
- Recipes for other paint products
- Disposable tools for mixing and manipulating paint
- And more!

* Golden GAC-800 pouring medium will be supplied.

Student supply list

Since this may be the one of the first times that you're doing an acrylic paint pour, I've provided guidelines for selecting a pleasing color range. Be sure that your color set includes white and three colors. In this class, we'll be using recipes designed for Golden fluid acrylics. Here's what you should bring:

1. Four bottles of Golden Fluid Acrylic paint*:
 - **Minimum bottle size:** ½ ounce (15 mL) bottles are required, can instead bring 1 ounce (30 mL) or larger bottle is also okay
 - **Required:** Titanium White (preferred) or Zinc White
 - **Required colors (choose one set):**
 - **CMY:** Golden Fluid Acrylics Primary Magenta, Primary Yellow, and Primary Cyan
 - **Analogous:** Choose three adjacent hues on the color wheel (red/orange/yellow, blue/violet/red, etc.)



2. **Canvas:** two (or more) small canvases (8x10, 8x8, 6x6), wrapped or boards
3. **2 Foil roasting pans:** Need to be large enough to contain one canvas each.
